The **Gastroenterology Network** developed the first **National IBD training day**. **50 people** were able to attend with very positive feedback received from participants and there were requests for more days!

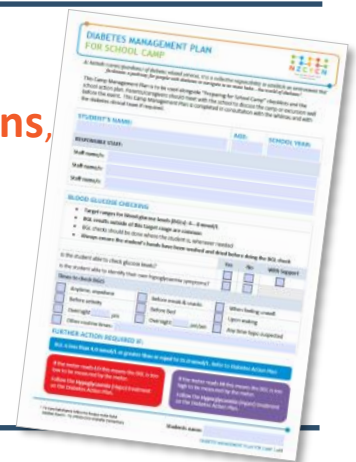
